First Scripture Readings

Psalm 34:1-10 Responsive

- ¹ I will extol the LORD at all times;
his praise will always be on my lips.
- ² I will glory in the LORD;
let the afflicted hear and rejoice.
- ³ **Glorify the LORD with me;
let us exalt his name together.**
- ⁴ I sought the LORD, and he answered me;
he delivered me from all my fears.

Ephesians 5:1-10, 18-20 Responsive

- ¹ Follow God's example, therefore, as dearly loved children, ² and walk in the way of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.
- ³ **But among you there must not be even a hint of sexual immorality, or of any kind of impurity, or of greed, because these are improper for God's holy people. ⁴ Not should there be obscenity, foolish talk or coarse joking, which are out of place, but rather thanksgiving.**
- ⁵ For of this you can be sure: No immoral, impure or greedy person—such a person is an idolater—has any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.
- ⁶ **Let no one deceive you with empty words, for because of such things God's wrath comes on those who are disobedient. ⁷ Therefore do not be partners with them.**
- ⁸ For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light ⁹ (for the fruit of the light consists in all goodness, righteousness and truth) ¹⁰ and find out what pleases the Lord.

¹⁸ Do not get drunk on wine, which leads to debauchery. Instead, be filled with the Spirit, ¹⁹ speaking to one another in psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, ²⁰ always giving thanks to God the Father for everything , in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.
