First Scripture Readings

(Reader: Donna Whiting)

Hebrews 10:11-18 Responsive

¹¹Day after day every priest stands and performs his religious duties; again and again he offers the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins.

¹²But when this priest had offered for all time one sacrifice for sins, he sat down at the right hand of God, ¹³and since that time he waits for his enemies to be made his footstool. ¹⁴For by one sacrifice he has made perfect forever those who are being made holy.

¹⁵The Holy Spirit also testifies to us about this. First he says:

¹⁶“This is the covenant I will make with them after that time, says the Lord. I will put my laws in their hearts, and I will write them on their minds.”

¹⁷Then he adds:

“Their sins and lawless acts I will remember no more.”

¹⁸And where these have been forgiven, sacrifice for sin is no longer necessary.

1 John 1:1—2:2 Responsive

¹ That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked at and our hands have touched—this we proclaim concerning the Word of life.

²The life appeared; we have seen it and testify to it, and we proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and has appeared to us.

³We proclaim to you what we have seen and heard, so that you also may have fellowship with us. **And our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son, Jesus Christ. ⁴We write this to make our joy complete.**

⁵This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all.

⁶If we claim to have fellowship with him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live out the truth. ⁷But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

⁸If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us. ⁹If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

¹⁰If we claim we have not sinned, we make him out to be a liar and his word is not in us.

¹ My dear children, I write this to you so that you will not sin. But if anybody does sin, we have an advocate with the Father—Jesus Christ, the Righteous One.

²He is the atoning sacrifice for our sins, and not only for ours but also for the sins of the whole world.

Second Scripture Readings

(Reader: Donna Whiting)

Revelation 5:1-10 Responsive

¹ Then I saw in the right hand of him who sat on the throne a scroll with writing on both sides and sealed with seven seals. ² And I saw a mighty angel proclaiming in a loud voice, "Who is worthy to break the seals and open the scroll?"

³ **But no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth could open the scroll or even look inside it. ⁴ I wept and wept because no one was found who was worthy to open the scroll or look inside.**

⁵ Then one of the elders said to me, "Do not weep! See, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has triumphed. He is able to open the scroll and its seven seals."

⁶ **Then I saw a Lamb, looking as if it had been slain, standing at the center of the throne, encircled by the four living creatures and the elders. The Lamb had seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth.**

⁷ He went and took the scroll from the right hand of him who sat on the throne. ⁸ And when he had taken it, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb. Each one had a harp and they were holding golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of God's people.

⁹ **And they sang a new song, saying:**

**“You are worthy to take the scroll
and to open its seals,
because you were slain,
and with your blood you purchased for God
persons from every tribe and language and people and nation.
¹⁰ You have made them to be a kingdom and priests to serve our God,
and they will reign on the earth.”**

John 20:19-31 Responsive

¹⁹ On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you!”

²⁰ **After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw the Lord.**

²¹ Again Jesus said, “Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.” ²² And with that he breathed on them and said, “Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive anyone’s sins, their sins are forgiven; if you do not forgive them, they are not forgiven.”

²⁴ **Now Thomas (also known as Didymus), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, “We have seen the Lord!”**

But he said to them, “Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.”

²⁶ **A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “Peace be with you!”**

²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, “Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe.”

²⁸ **Thomas said to him, “My Lord and my God!”**

²⁹ Then Jesus told him, “Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.”

³⁰ **Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not recorded in this book. ³¹ But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.**

Greetings at this wonderful time of year. We pray that the fullness of our salvation, the promise of the resurrection and the power of the indwelling Spirit of God is your joy today and every day.

In March we had very special Zoom calls with both the Central Asia Care for Leaders group and with the annual Central Asia Consultation (CAC). The CAC zoom call was encouraging as we heard reports from each country presented by cherished friends and leaders. It was the best of virtual possibilities but we missed the face-to-face meetings, the sharing of meals and the awesome Russian-English worship times.

Here are two of the encouraging reports from that call:

Although nine countries reported difficult economic situations and Covid related deaths of church members, family or friends, they also praised the Lord for the expanded outreach they accomplished through virtual services and small group meetings and new opportunities for humanitarian involvement within their communities. Several churches received commendations from their local or national governments! Many who would have never entered a church building received salvation through virtual home meetings

A pastor from Turkmenistan told us that no pastors had died due to Covid in his country. This is an amazing report of God's protection, especially with such poor medical care.

The Care for Leaders group are creating specific and diverse methods to minister to pastors and leaders who are discouraged and fatigued. Some are involved in a training which focuses on healing from early abuse as well as spiritual encouragement and theological truth. Others are developing centers for retreat and healing along with coaching. Still others are organizing retreats for pastors and their families, as well as regular local gatherings for sharing and fellowship. We rejoice to see how God is guiding each person and each couple to come alongside the leaders of God's Church to give them much needed time and attention to their very challenging lives. This is happening in some part because you have prayed and have given to our Jars of Clay account at Barnabas which we have used to send several pastors and families to get a rest, a very new concept in this area of the world. God used their experiences among other factors to launch this movement.

Personally we are well having had Covid at separate times and are grateful that there were no complications or residual effects. Carol had her four year echocardiogram in March and was again pleased to hear that her heart is "perfect".

Thank you for your prayers for the church in Central Asia and for us as we continue to mentor, encourage, pray with them and stay available to listen to their needs and victories.

May you sense God's love in fresh ways as you focus on His amazing salvation this Easter weekend.
