Hebrews 10:5-10 Responsive

⁵Therefore, when Christ came into the world, he said:

“Sacrifice and offering you did not desire,
but a body you prepared for me;

⁶with burnt offerings and sin offerings
you were not pleased.

⁷Then I said, “Here I am—it is written about me in the scroll—
I have come to do your will, my God.””
