Psalm 49 Responsive

¹ Hear this, all you peoples; listen, all who live in this world, ²both low and high, rich and poor alike: ³My mouth will speak words of wisdom; the meditation of my heart will give you understanding. ⁴I will turn my ear to a proverb; with the harp I will expound my riddle: ⁵Why should I fear when evil days come, when wicked deceivers surround me-6 those who trust in their wealth and boast of their great riches? ⁷No one can redeem the life of another or give to God a ransom for them-If the ransom for a life is costly, no payment is ever enough— ⁹ so that they should live on forever and not see decay. ¹⁰For all can see that the wise die, that the foolish and the senseless also perish, leaving their wealth to others. ¹¹Their tombs will remain their houses forever, their dwellings for endless generations, though they had named lands after themselves. ¹² People, despite their wealth, do not endure; they are like the beasts that perish. ¹³This is the fate of those who trust in themselves, and of their followers, who approve their sayings. ¹⁴They are like sheep and are destined to die; death will be their shepherd

(but the upright will prevail over them in the morning). Their forms will decay in the grave,

far from their princely mansions.

¹⁵But God will redeem me from the realm of the dead; he will surely take me to himself.

¹⁶Do not be overawed when others grow rich, when the splendor of their houses increases; ¹² for they will take nothing with them when they die, their splendor will not descend with them.

 ¹⁸Though while they live they count themselves blessed and people praise you when you prosper—
 ¹⁹they will join those who have gone before them, who will never again see the light of life.

²⁰ People who have wealth but lack understanding are like the beasts that perish.

1 Timothy 6:3-10, 17-19 Responsive

³ If anyone teaches otherwise and does not agree to the sound instruction of our Lord Jesus Christ and to godly teaching, ⁴they are conceited and understand nothing.

They have an unhealthy interest in controversies and quarrels about words that result in envy, strife, malicious talk, evil suspicions ⁵ and constant friction between people of corrupt mind, who have been robbed of the truth and who think that godliness is a means to financial gain.

⁶ But godliness with contentment is great gain. ⁷ For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it. ⁸ But if we have food and clothing, we will be content with that. ⁹ Those who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge people into ruin and destruction.

¹⁰ For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs.

¹⁷Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment.

¹⁸Command them to do good, to be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. ¹⁹In this way they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life.
