## **First Scripture Readings**

(Reader: Donna Whiting)

### Isaiah 53:1-9 Responsive

- <sup>1</sup> Who has believed our message and to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?
- He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground.
   He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him.
- <sup>3</sup> He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain. Like one from whom people hide their faces he was despised, and we held him in low esteem.
- <sup>4</sup> Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted.
- <sup>5</sup> But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds we are healed.
- <sup>6</sup> We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to our own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.
- <sup>7</sup> He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.
- By oppression and judgment he was taken away.
   Yet who of his generation protested?
   For he was cut off from the land of the living;
   for the transgression of my people he was punished.
- <sup>9</sup> He was assigned a grave with the wicked, and with the rich in his death, though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth.

#### Romans 15:1-13

- <sup>1</sup> We who are strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak and not to please ourselves. <sup>2</sup> Each of us should please our neighbors for their good, to build them up. <sup>3</sup> For even Christ did not please himself but, as it is written: "The insults of those who insult you have fallen on me."
- <sup>4</sup> For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope.
- <sup>5</sup> May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, <sup>6</sup> so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- <sup>7</sup> Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. <sup>8</sup> For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the Jews on behalf of God's truth, so that the promises made to the patriarchs might be confirmed <sup>9</sup> and, moreover, that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written:
- "Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles; I will sing the praises of your name."

  10 Again, it says,
- "Rejoice, you Gentiles, with his people."
- <sup>11</sup> And again,
- "Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles; let all the peoples extol him."

  12 And again, Isaiah says,
- "The Root of Jesse will spring up, one who will arise to rule over the nations; in him the Gentiles will hope."
- <sup>13</sup> May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

## **Second Scripture Readings**

(Reader: Bruce Terras)

### Matthew 27:27-44 Responsive

<sup>27</sup> Then the governor's soldiers took Jesus into the Praetorium and gathered the whole company of soldiers around him. <sup>28</sup> They stripped him and put a scarlet robe on him, <sup>29</sup> and then twisted together a crown of thorns and set it on his head. They put a staff in his right hand.

Then they knelt in front of him and mocked him. "Hail, king of the Jews!" they said. <sup>30</sup> They spit on him, and took the staff and struck him on the head again and again. <sup>31</sup> After they had mocked him, they took off the robe and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him away to crucify him.

<sup>32</sup> As they were going out, they met a man from Cyrene, named Simon, and they forced him to carry the cross. <sup>33</sup> They came to a place called Golgotha (which means "the place of the skull"). <sup>34</sup> There they offered Jesus wine to drink, mixed with gall; but after tasting it, he refused to drink it.

<sup>35</sup> When they had crucified him, they divided up his clothes by casting lots. <sup>36</sup> And sitting down, they kept watch over him there. <sup>37</sup> Above his head they placed the written charge against him: THIS IS JESUS, THE KING OF THE JEWS.

<sup>38</sup> Two rebels were crucified with him, one on his right and one on his left. <sup>39</sup> Those who passed by hurled insults at him, shaking their heads <sup>40</sup> and saying, "You who are going to destroy the temple and build it in three days, save yourself! Come down from the cross, if you are the Son of God!"

<sup>41</sup> In the same way the chief priests, the teachers of the law and the elders mocked him. <sup>42</sup> "He saved others," they said, "but he can't save himself! He's the king of Israel! Let

him come down now from the cross, and we will believe in him. <sup>43</sup> He trusts in God. Let God rescue him now if he wants him, for he said, 'I am the Son of God.'"

<sup>44</sup> In the same way the rebels who were crucified with him also heaped insults on him.

## Psalm 69:7-21 Responsive

- <sup>7</sup> For I endure scorn for your sake, and shame covers my face.
- 8 I am a foreigner to my own family,
   a stranger to my own mother's children;
   9 for zeal for your house consumes me,
   and the insults of those who insult you fall on me.
- <sup>10</sup> When I weep and fast, I must endure scorn;
- <sup>11</sup> when I put on sackcloth, people make sport of me.
- <sup>12</sup> Those who sit at the gate mock me, and I am the song of the drunkards.
- <sup>13</sup> But I pray to you, LORD, in the time of your favor; in your great love, O God, answer me with your sure salvation.
- <sup>14</sup> Rescue me from the mire, do not let me sink;
  deliver me from those who hate me, from the deep waters.
  <sup>15</sup> Do not let the floodwaters engulf me or the depths swallow me up or the pit close its mouth over me.
- <sup>16</sup> Answer me, LORD, out of the goodness of your love; in your great mercy turn to me.
- <sup>17</sup> Do not hide your face from your servant; answer me quickly, for I am in trouble.

- <sup>18</sup> Come near and rescue me; deliver me because of my foes.
- <sup>19</sup> You know how I am scorned, disgraced and shamed; all my enemies are before you.
- <sup>20</sup> Scorn has broken my heart and has left me helpless;
   I looked for sympathy, but there was none, for comforters, but I found none.
- <sup>21</sup> They put gall in my food and gave me vinegar for my thirst.
